This past week, residents and staff of the Baldwin Care Center began experiencing flulike symptoms including nausea, vomiting and diarrhea. It seems to be a 24 hour bug. The facility got testing kits from St. Croix County Public Health and sent them to Wisconsin State Laboratory of Hygiene to test for norovirus. We do not have the results back yet. The facility is strongly discouraging visits. It is your choice if you want to visit a family member. This seems to be a pretty contagious virus. This is not the type of "flu" that you can be vaccinated against. The influenza that people were vaccinated for in the

Fall is for the respiratory flu, not this type of flu. Staff who have been caring for ill residents have also come down with the virus. Our guidelines are very specific regarding the amount of time that staff must be off work. Staff who are ill should be off work for 48 hours after symptoms cease. Other staff who are not ill have been working additional shifts. Thank you to all the staff who are caring for residents during this challenging time. Because of the gastrointestinal flu, residents have been in their rooms for meals and we are not having group activities because of the possibility of spreading the virus. We hope to be back to normal soon.
